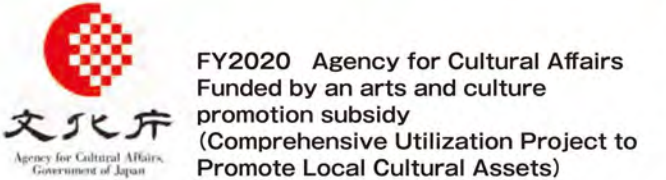

- By train from Narita Airport
- From Narita Airport Terminal 2 Station, take the Narita Express for Tokyo, and transfer at Sakura Station to the Soba Main Line train for Choshi.
- By highway bus from Tokyo Station
- About 2 hr. 40 min. from Tokyo Station Yaesu Exit to Cape Inubosaki Bus stop: In front of the Tokyo Tatemono Building, across the street from Yaesu Central Exit

Twilight walks in Choshi

Choshi is suited to twilight. Watching the setting sun dip below the waters of the Pacific in the distance can leave many different impressions on people's hearts. As you watch the gradation change from deep scarlet to ultramarine, feel the contrast of impermanence and eternity, and listen for the whispers of hope for our tomorrow.

- 01** Choshi Bridge at twilight
Choshi Bridge, which spans the Tone River, changes its appearance by season and time of day. The way it looks in twilight projects unwavering strength, evoking the idea of a bridge between today and tomorrow.

Walking Choshi's side streets

On Choshi's fanciful backstreets, you may discover wonders unknown even to locals, like fun-filled side streets, back roads unchanged since olden times, alleys where you could imagine encountering a deity, or sunny spots just for cats to nap...

- 08** The cats of Tokawa soaking up the sun
Experience time the way cats do, in leisurely, sun-soaked, sea-scented hours. Who knows—according to cats, the area around the Tokawa River may be renowned as a dream destination.

Walking the seaside of Choshi

Choshi has long lived in harmony with the sea. Since time immemorial, it has captured the fancy of many travelers for the way being thrust out into the Pacific Ocean allows you to feel the vastness of the ocean and how the Earth is bared to its rough waves.

- 17** Byoubugaura Sea Cliff and the cliff edges eroded by the sea
Seeing the grand geological formations stretching into the distance, you may feel an awareness of the weight of time or compare your own existence with that grandeur. That meaningful experience is what we call “Choshi-Time.”

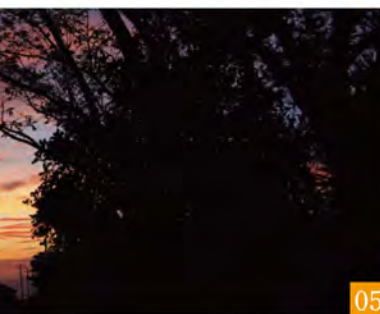
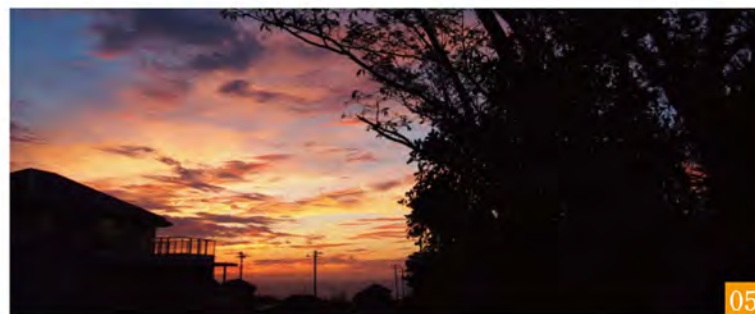

Choshi-Time is the special way that time seems to pass here in Choshi. The past, present, and future seem to overlap in leisurely waves, gently breaking down walls in the hearts of those who visit.



- 02** Tokawa Station : The final stop on the Choshi Electric Railway. Come and experience its Showa nostalgia.
03 Choshi Fishing Port : The sight of the port at sunset is complemented by the call of seagulls, announcing the end of another day.
04 Choshi Marina : The best spot to witness the evening sun dipping below the waters of the Pacific in the distance.
05 The townscape of Choshi : Illuminated by sunset, even its familiar views become works of art.



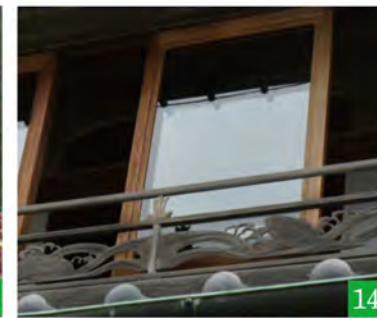
- 06** Sunflower fields at sunset : When tomorrow comes, once again, the sunflowers will turn their faces toward the sky and the windmills will pick up the wind.
07 Cabbage fields and the Choshi Electric Railway : The seaside farmland is perfect for cultivating cabbage. Choshi produces juicy spring cabbage in higher volumes than anywhere else in Japan.
09 Kawaguchi-Jinja Shrine : Feel your mind becoming clearer with each and every stone step you ascend.



- 10** The deity Asama : At seasonal turning points, people flock to her shrine to pray for a year of safety.
11 Nagasaki Settlement : A fisherman's village has a distinct atmosphere. Here, the sea breeze is linked with the rhythm of people's lives.
12 The Tokawa townscape : The afternoon is also a good time to walk down Tokawa's many sea-facing hill roads.



- 13** Oshiomatsuri : On the 15th day of the 6th month of the old lunar calendar, people hoist a majestic portable shrine in a show of gratitude to and reverence for the ocean.
14 The proprietors of Isokaku House : Isokaku is where wholesalers of light cargo vessels used to do business. You can still feel their energy today.
15 Inuma Kannon : The hustle and bustle of the town around Inuma Kannon was the model for the way Choshi looks today.
16 Former Nishibiro Family Home : You can feel the passage of time in how fishermen lived from the Edo period onward.



- 18** Nagasaki Seaside : The best spot for playing on the beach, Nagasaki Seaside is very popular with children.
19 Tokawa Fishing Port : On a sunny day, take a walk through Tokawa Fishing Port and let the sight of the broad, towering sky above soothe your heart.
20 The view of Cape Inubasaki from Kimigahama : The cape's face varies depending on the season and time of day.



- 21** Inuiwa Dog Rock : Weathering the rough waves has given it a look that is solitary and strong yet sad.
22 Plant life that complements the sea : Enjoy the many lovely flowers you can see around Choshi's beaches.
23 Tokawahama Beach : They say that the wind still carries the sounds of busy fishermen from long ago.
